Originally from New Orleans, Louisiana, Gwyn Green graduated from Saint Mary's College in South Bend, Indiana and Married Dan Green, a Notre Dame graduate. They moved to the Denver area after Dan's service in the air Force. They have four adult children, three daughters-in-law, and ten grandchildren. Representative Green worked tenaciously as a Golden City councilor for her constituents and to preserve Golden's historic landmarks. She was known for her dedication to historic preservation, to the environment, and to preserving our mountain backdrop,

In 2004, Representative Green was asked to run for the Colorado State Legislature and served in that capacity for five years, retiring in July 2009 for health reasons. During her tenure, she received multiple awards for legislative excellence, among them the Legislator of the Year Award from the Colorado Public Health Association: and Distinguished Legislator awards from the National Association of Social Workers; the Colorado Society of Clinical Social Workers; the Jefferson County Labor Advisory Board; Recording for Blind and Dyslexic, and an Award of Appreciation for Golden City Council for her years of service to Golden both as a City Councilor and as a State Legislator. Representative Green was known for her strong advocacy for Golden, for children, and for health care.

Presently, Gwyn is active in both civic and church groups. Most of all, Gwyn enjoys being with her family, especially her ten grandchildren!
