Carole Lomond, M.A.

Carole Lomond was the Publisher-Editor-Photojournalist for Jefferson County *City and Mountain Views* magazine 1993-2014. She published *Youthink* magazine with teenagers (1979-80). She has created three history books: Lariat Loop Scenic & Historic Byway (2002), Jefferson County, Colorado (650-page) (2009), and History of Mount Vernon Canyon (2015).

Carole was born April 24, 1938 in Plymouth, Michigan and grew up working with her parents operating a golf course near Ann Arbor. By age 12, she could manage the first tee, short-order cook, bar maid, keep the books for the pro shop and play championship golf. After two years at Michigan State University, she was an American Airlines stewardess and married a corporate man in Chicago and then Kansas City.

She enjoyed parenting and homemaking, creating art and writing, and volunteering for the PTA, and League of Women Voters. After 13 years of marriage, she raised three children as a single parent while practicing psychotherapy for 15 years. They moved to Winter Park in 1975 and later lived in Evergreen and Lakewood. Her children are now successfully approaching the “second half of life” and raising six children. Carole completed a Master’s Degree in Psychotherapy through University of Northern Colorado outreach program.

Carole especially enjoys discovering history and community photojournalism to enrich people with where they live! She has supported Evergreen, Golden, and West Chambers of Commerce, Denver Woman’s Press Club and Jefferson County Historical Commission.

Having researched multiple communities and interviewed hundreds of Jefferson County residents, Lomond is now preparing to move to Golden after living on Lookout Mountain for the past 28 years. Her title of the Golden chapter in her Jefferson County history book is “Golden: Small Town, Great Democracy!”
